## Glossary of Terms

<b>Administrator password</b>	Administrator accounts have the ability to change settings on your computer. This could be your normal account or a second account used only for changing configurations.
<b>Browser</b>	A browser is a computer program or mobile app that is used to find and look at information on the Internet.
<b>iOS</b>	Apple operating system for mobile devices.
<b>Malware</b>	Software designed primarily for a malicious purpose.
<b>Operating System</b>	An operating system is the main program in a computer such as Windows or Apple OSX that makes it possible for other programs to function.
<b>Patch</b>	A software patch is a change applied to the code of a program after it is released to fix a potential problem.
<b>Toolbar (Browser)</b>	A browser toolbar is an add-on that provides a feature. Usually these features are not useful and the toolbar can send information to marketing companies.
<b>Update</b>	A software update is a change applied to the code of a program to improve function of the program.
